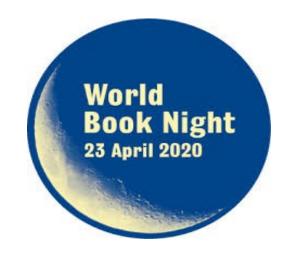

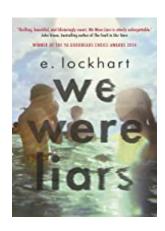
### Shakespeare's Birthday

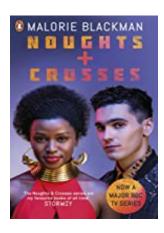
 William Shakespeare (1564-1616), poet and playwright, is considered by many to be the greatest dramatist of all time. His works include tragedies (Hamlet, MacBeth), comedies (A Midsummer Night's Dream, As You Like It) and histories (Julius Caesar, Richard II, Troilus and Cressida).

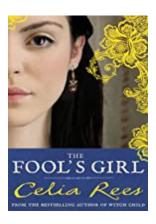
In total, he is reckoned to have written 37 plays and over 150 poems.
 Most of the latter were sonnets (14 line poems), the most famous being 'Shall I compare thee to a summer's day...'

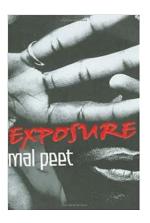
### Shakespeare's Influence

conflict etc. Why not try one of the novels below ...



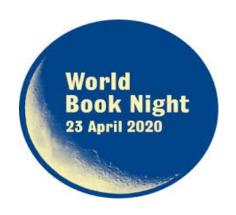






## World Book Night
