1	S4-6	Assessment	What school work is taken into consideration for the assessment that Teachers will make?	The SQA continues to work with schools regarding assessment updates and on a return to schools, pupils will be assessed in line with the SQA's Nat5, Highers and Advanced Higher assessment procedures. The focus on online learning in January and February is the delivery of quality learning for pupils. Ms Mariani will keep pupils and parents updated with any information from SQA
2	S4-6	Assessment	What will happen about Prelims?	We are planning to hold prelims when pupils return to schools, if the reopening plans allow for year group returns. How prelims are held will depend on the format of re-opening schools.
3	S4-6	Assessment	What is happening about exams?	All N5, H, and AH formal exams have been cancelled for session 2020-21. We are still awaiting guidance from Scot Gov and SQA on the structure of assessments. We will communicate with pupils and parents as soon as we have further information.
4	S4-6	Assessment	What proportion of time should pupils be concentrating on new work and what proportion on revision?	Teachers are using Education Scotland's guidance and delivering new materials to support progression in their subjects. As soon as we find out about the structure of assessment, we will provide more information on what pupils need to revise and the timescales.
5	S4-6	Assessment	When might we know about Higher assessment arrangements?	All secondary schools are waiting for the SQA to give updates on N5, H, and AH assessment arrangements. When schools are updated with SQA assessment arrangements we will contact parents. We will communicate with pupils and parents as soon as we have further information.
7	S1-3	Learning	How much learning should my child be doing?	As per Education Scotland guidance and detailed in the St Thomas' RL policy, pupils should be studying around 15 to 20 hours a week. This equates to around 3 hours minimum a day.

Learning experience by sharing good practice amongst staff, support staff with professional development, listening and acting upon the views of parents and pupils and looking outwards to the good practice of other schools in Edinburgh Council and other Councils in Scotland.
18	All	Learning	Can teachers ensure they're directing pupils to trusted and reliable resources (checking the links are still live) when issuing work?	Of course, we will endeavour to get our communication as simple and efficient as possible.
19	All	Learning	What is St Thomas's view of its online learning provision in relation to that offered by comparator schools? Is there a reason that St Thomas's seems to be offering less interactive learning and teaching?	St Thomas' has improved the Remote Learning experience from Lockdown 1 and is aspirational in continuing to improve the Remote Learning in this Lockdown. The school is improving its online presentation in terms of recorded delivery and we are delivering a breadth and depth of live interactions in the senior phase. The parent and pupil survey will identify areas which we could improve on and as a collegiate school community we will evaluate where such improvements can be made. St Thomas has a catchment area 1/3rd of Edinburgh and with so many schools which St Thomas' can be compared with in terms of size, Social Index of Multiple Deprivation, Free School Meal entitlement, SQA exam results, Inclusion and Equality, and Learning and Teaching, we wish to share our good practice and learn from all Edinburgh Secondary Schools.
20	All	Learning	Why is the live learning that is on offer optional?	St Thomas is following the Education Scotland and Edinburgh Learns guidance on Remote Learning by supporting a blend of learning - (add in page 2 paragraph of Education Scotland RL policy). 21	S4-6	Learning	How much learning should my child be doing?	As per Education Scotland guidance and detailed in the St Thomas' RL policy, pupils should be studying around 20 to 25 hours a week. This equates to around 4 hours minimum a day.
45	All	Microsoft Teams	How does my child access Teams?	All pupils have access to MS Teams and we have also placed information for Parents on the school website to support MS Teams understanding. 46	All	Microsoft Teams	Can I access Teams myself as the parent without accessing it through my child?	MS Teams class groups are centred around Pupil/Teacher interaction and your child can show you all their MS Teams classes. As a parent I sit down once a day and go through each of my children's MS Teams work to offer support.

The Scottish Government will lead on when it is appropriate for schools to reopen and will coplan with Local Authorities in how plans to reopen schools safely. We will provide parents with as much notice as possible and this will be communicated by email and also text.
23	All	Return to School/Ble nded	If lockdown is extended when will we know?	The Scottish Government has daily briefings on its Coronavirus 19 plans. The next statement by The First Minister is on Tuesday 2nd of February. The First Minister makes statements every 3 weeks. We will provide parents with as much notice as possible and this will be communicated by email and also text.
24	All	Return to School/Ble nded	What are your plans for a blended model e.g. 50% in class, 50% remote learning?	Plans for blended learning are dependent on how The Scottish Government decides to reopen schools safely. Last term all pupils were in school with pupils in year bubbles. If a 2-metre rule is introduced for the return of pupils to the St Thomas building then the school can only have 1/3rd of pupils in on classes. The Health and safety Team measured all classrooms in June 2020 to know what can be achieved with a 2-metre rule. St Thomas' will work in partnership with CEC to identify how other areas of the school and other premises can be used to achieve a 50% pupil population return. Blended Learning plans will be dependent on how schools will be reopened by The Scottish Government.

St Thomas' will be using Education Scotland's Learner Entitlements to look at further developments for the BGE (S1-3)

Parents can help by supporting a daily structure for their children which includes a healthy breakfast/lunch/dinner and a routine of school work and health and wellbeing breaks. Have a clear end of the day structure away from screens. It's helpful to encourage your child to access educational material including historical films, documentaries etc. BBC are providing content daily on television and on BBC iPlayer.

Staff are working really hard to ensure queries are answered as quickly as possible and detailed feedback is given to pupils. "Ask the Teacher" is a private conversation with the Teacher and can't be seen by the whole class. Some teachers are using email with their class.
41	All	Teacher Interaction	How can I as a parent/carer ask questions from the teachers to assist my child?	Please ask your child to directly ask the Teacher questions to support their learning, this will be the most efficient way to have questions answered. They can access this through a private conversation this way on Teams. Some teachers have asked pupils to also email them directly on their school email.
